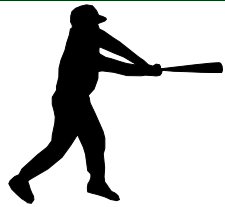

## ***Margaretta VS Bellevue***

The Margaretta baseball team lost to Bellevue, ending the game with 9 runs and Margaretta 2.

Bellevue scored eight runs in the four opening innings to top the Polar Bears in their SBC crossover game. Dalton Hay, Philip Putnam and Ethan Prenatt all had two hits each for Bellevue (1-1), which also got three RBIs from Trey Ruhlman.

Prenatt got the win, tossing three scoreless innings, striking out six. Bryce Graffin had a double and an RBI for Margaretta (0-1).

## ***Margaretta VS Woodward***

Margaretta had a large victory against Woodward, scoring 18 runs to Woodward's 0.

Zach Luma allowed a single on the mound for Margaretta as they picked up its first win of the year. Luma struck out six and walked one.

At the plate, Bryce Graffin went a perfect 4-for-4 with three RBIs and two runs scored. Spencer Michel was 3-for-5 with four runs scored and Dylan Popke had two hits, including a double. Tallen Kennedy had three RBIs, Luma and Jake Leibacher had two.

## ***Margaretta VS Tiffin Columbian***

Margaretta lost a hard fought game against Tiffin Columbian, 6-5.

Zach Luma surrendered just four hits in six innings, tallying four strikeouts to three walks. Tallen Kennedy led Margaretta at the plate, going 2-for-4 with two RBIs. Jake Leibacher had two hits and scored two runs.

## ***Margaretta VS Plymouth***

Tallen Kennedy reached on an error to bringing in the game-winning run as Margaretta slipped past Plymouth, 5-4.

Brycetynn Hedden led off the inning with a walk for the Polar Bears (3-4) then was replaced on the base by Brandon Eisenhauer. A Jake Leibacher bunt single pushed Eisenhauer to third to setup the winning play.

Kennedy went 2-for-4 with a double and home-run and two RBIs. Zach Luma added two hits and was the winning pitcher, going the full seven innings where he gave up four runs (three earned) on seven hits. He struck out three and walked one.

## ***Margaretta VS Edison***

At Milan, Thomas Simon's infield single in the sixth inning scored the go-ahead for the Chargers who held off a rally from the Polar Bears to earn a Bay Division victory.

Margaretta had cut a 5-2 deficit to 5-4, then after Edison scored twice in the fifth, the Bears scored three times in the top of the sixth to knot things up at 6-all.

Carson Kennedy had four RBIs, despite not getting credited for any hits. Jake Leibacher singled twice and added three runs scored.

None of the runs against Edison were earned. Simon had seven strikeouts in five innings, giving up four unearned runs on five hits.

## ***Margaretta VS Port Clinton***

At Castalia, the Redskins scored seven runs in their final two innings at the plate to run away from the Polar Bears in an SBC Bay win.

For Margaretta, Zach Luma had two hits and three RBIs. Jake Leibacher had two hits and scored two runs.

Jose Rangel had eight strikeouts in the recording the win.

## March 26 - Dual v. Huron

Welcome back to track! March 26th officially started our school track meets.

The first meet of the season was a dual meet against Huron. The score for the girls was Margaretta with 77, and Huron with 54. In event 7, which is the Girls 4x200 Meter Relay, Margaretta got first. The relay team consisted of Kylie Cheek, Cassidy Cheek, Brittany Kingseed, and Jana Berg. The time for the relay was 1:56.80.

For the boys, Margaretta had a score of 44, while Huron had a score of 93. For event 8, which is the Boys 4x200 Meter Relay, the boys also got first. The boys team consisted of Asa Fletcher, James Weaver, Daltyn Wiedbrauk, and Cayden Orshoski. The time for the relay was 1:43.86.

## April 6 - Lakota Invite

The Lakota Invite had a total of 16 schools participating. The girls team placed 2nd overall.

In Event 5, which is the Girls Discus Throw, Grace Bias received first place out of a total of 32 other girls competing. She ended with a throw of 116-07.

The boys team placed 14th overall. In Event 8, which is the Boys High Jump, Daltyn Wiedbrauk received third place with a jump of 6-00.



## April 2 - Dual v. Oak Harbor

The Oak Harbor Dual Meet took place on April 2nd. Both girls and boys teams got second place. The girls had a score of 48.

For the Girls 100 Meter Dash, Kenna Stimmel got first place with a time of 13.62. Kenna also received first in the Girls 100 Meter Hurdles with a time of 16.74.

The boys had a score of 26. In the Boys 110 Meter Hurdles, Cayden Orshoski received first place with a time of 18.57. In the boys Pole Vault, Ethan Garcia got first with a vault of 8-06.

## April 9 - Dual v. Willard

The overall score for the girls team was 74.

In Event 1, which is the Girls 4x800 Meter Relay, Margaretta received first place. The team included Miranda Billman, Jessie Opfer, Paige Harmon, and Breanna Pullano. Their time was 11:47.46.

The boys team had an overall score of 44.

In Event 2, which is the boys 4x800 Meter Relay, the team received first. The team included Alex Richter, Josh Miller, Glen Alkire, and Spencer Flick. Their time was 9:22.83.

## April 13th- Edison Invite

The Edison Invite took place on April 13th. The invite was against a total of 12 schools. The girls team had a score of 82, and they got 2nd place. The boys team had a score of 19.50, and received 10th place.

Kenna Stimmel was named the girls MVP for the meet as she broke the meet record (12-0) set by her sister Kassidie. Kenna's vault was 12-6. She also won the 100 hurdles and 100 meter dash, and was part of the 4x100 team along with Kylee Cheek, Cassidy Cheek and Jana Berg that finished second.

Grace Bias won the throwing events with a shot put of 35-2.5 and a discus throw of 118-2.

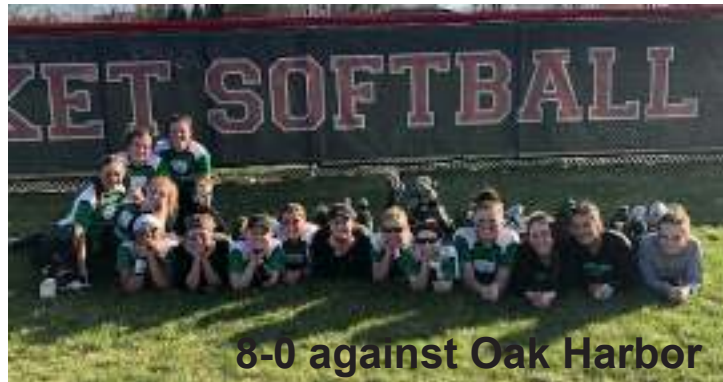

MHS Senior Mark Miller recently signed his national letter of intent to Malone University to further his education and swim.



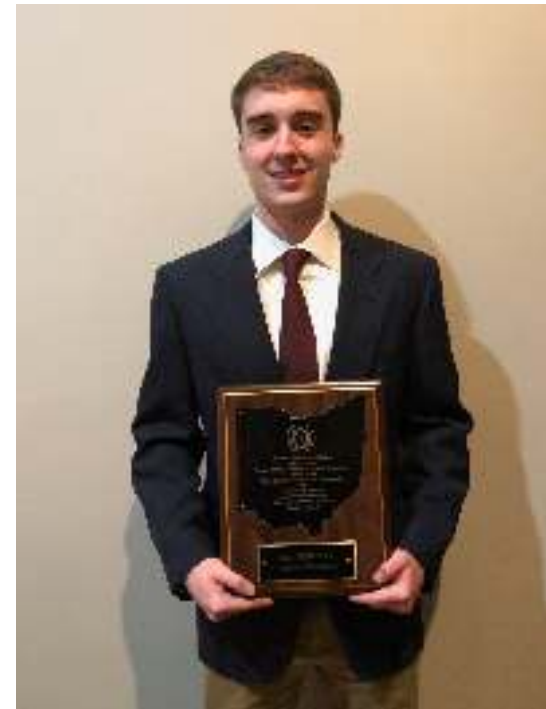
## Nick Leibacher Honored
