To: Parents and Guardians of 6th - 11th Grade Students

Re: College Credit Plus Program (CCP+)

Ohio Revised Code 3365 established a College Credit Plus Program, which allows college-ready students in grades seven through twelve, who qualify for college admission (each college will set their own criteria for student eligibility), to take college level courses while in middle or high school. These students will earn college credit and high school graduation credit through the successful completion of college courses. The purpose of the program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and expose students to options beyond the high school classroom. Students may have to take Ohio State Tests (OST's), depending on the subject area. Once enrolled in a college class, the student can only take 120 total college credit hours up through school graduation.

This year there will be a face-to-face meeting at EHOVE on Wednesday, February 9, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in the Technology Center. If students are unable to attend this informational session, interested students, parents and guardians are required to log onto <https://www.ohiohighered.org/ccp/resources> and view an "Informational Session." There is both a slide show and a video that must be viewed.

Students/Parents must notify the school prior to April 1, 2022 of their intent to participate in the College Credit Plus Program. Students/Parents must sign a form indicating that appropriate counseling was provided and all responsibilities for participation are understood. For your convenience, a form is attached to this letter. Additionally, this form can be obtained by scrolling down from the "Information Session" at the above website. Click on the "Intent to Participate In College Credit Plus" form. Print this form, fill it out and turn it into the Student Service office prior to the due date (April 1, 2022). This form is also available in the back of our course description book. The same form will be available in our Student Services Office if students choose to pick one up in person.
