#### New PK-12 Facility and Financial Update

#### **New PK-12 Facility Update:**

- In 2020, Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) committed to fund our project at 38%
- We began collecting Nexus pipeline incremental taxes in the spring of 2019
  - Collected 3 ½ years of taxes to date (Nexus short paying 40% 66% of billed amounts)
  - Reached a settlement with Nexus in June 2022 at 58% of the billed taxes or 84% of Nexus' original projected taxes, we then had our groundbreaking ceremony in July 2022 and we began site and utility prep work, assuming no counties would appeal this settlement
    - Settlement appealed by Lorain County twice awaiting the outcome of second appeal
- Project financials have been negatively impacted by these multiple rounds of tax settlement and collection delays both financing costs and estimated total construction costs continue to increase
  - o In Feb. 2020 Construction costs were estimated at approximately \$40M
  - o In June, 2022 construction costs were ~\$64M and annual financing payments of \$3.6M
  - o In May, 2023 estimates are approximately \$70M and the annual financial payments of \$3.9M
- Project paused until Nexus final tax settlement payments are locked in or would have to go back to the taxpayers for a bond issue to be able to continue construction

#### New PK-12 Facility and Financial Update

#### Financial Update:

- We have had significant Nexus tax payment fluctuations in the 3 ½ years, making it very difficult to predict our revenue to run the district and covering our operational expenses
  - As demonstrated with 1st half 2022 taxes at \$2.8M, then 1st half 2023 at \$1.5M
    - Losing \$1.3M taxes is significant with average monthly spending levels of \$1.3M
- Three of the last four years, our State Funding has dropped approximately \$(0.4)M per year
- The District has not requested any new property tax dollars since 2010 for operational costs
- We continue to try to 'Right Size' the school district costs for our current student population
- We utilized our federal grant assistant from the pandemic to advance our literacy initiatives
- However due to the Nexus tax revenue fluctuations, we utilized a portion of the Nexus dollars that were set aside for the new PK-12 building, to run the day-to-day operations of the district
- Working to mitigate the districts financial fluctuations & uncertainty
